Topic and Speaker: Dr. Herb Dedo, formerly of UCSF Medical School for 45 years. The National Institutes of Health paid to set up and operate his Laboratory to research paralysis of the vocal cords. He was chief of Head and Neck surgery, taught ENT residents and medical students, introduced several operations to San Francisco, invented a few more operations and invented 20 surgical instruments. He published over 100 papers and gave over 200 lectures from Australia to Stockholm and received a few awards.

MEETING NOTES: Community Resources for Independent Living (CRIL) - Assistive Technology

Lending Program

At the March 9, 2019 HLAA-EB Chapter meeting, our guest speaker was **Michael Galvan**, **PhD**, **Program Director at Community Resources for Independent Living (CRIL)**. Dr. Galvan described CRIL's services & Assistive Technology (AT) Lending Program for independent living with a special emphasis on adaptive equipment for those experiencing hearing loss. CRIL has 3 offices locally with the



main office in Hayward and 2 branch offices in Fremont & Livermore. CRIL is one of 12 Device Lending Libraries (DLLs) in California that is able to provide devices on loan to eligible users.

CRIL'S MISSION: CRIL is a 40-year-old peer-based organization ". . . that advocates and provides resources for people with disabilities to improve lives and make communities fully accessible." CRIL offers *free* independent living services to individuals who self-identify as living with disabilities in Southern & Eastern Alameda County. The Federal ADA law guides CRIL in clarifying & specifically defining "Individual with a significant disability . . . " See <u>29 U.S.C. 706; 34 CFR 364.4</u>.

CRIL'S SERVICES: CRIL offers many independent living services at no charge (since we as taxpayers are already paying for them):

- Information & Referral (I & R): Provides a centralized resource for disability-related services & equipment.
- Housing Search Assistance: Teaches how to find & access available housing for individuals with disabilities.
- ➤ **Personal Assistant Referral:** Assists consumers with obtaining private-pay, in-home care personal assistants.
- > **Benefits Advocacy:** Educates about financial benefits to which persons with disabilities are entitled.
- **Employment Benefits Assistance:** Provides employment & vocational benefits counseling.
- Peer Support: Offers on-going support by independent living coordinators & peer support groups.
- Independent Living Skills (ILS) Training: Trains individuals in necessary skills for daily independent living.
- > **Travel Training:** Provides individual & group transit training in using the bus, BART & paratransit services.
- ➤ Accessible Van Share: Makes wheelchair accessible vans available for rent on a low-rate, hourly basis.
- > Community Leadership Academy: Provides five-week leadership training for participation on local boards.
- Individual Advocacy: Works with individual consumers & provides workshops on self-advocacy skills.
- > Systems Advocacy & Community Organizing: Advocates through its disability action network for equal access.
- > Assistive Technology (AT) Referral & Loan: Identifies & loans devices to accommodate individual disabilities.
- > Other Services: Provides non-partisan voter education/registration & disaster preparedness workshops.

CRIL'S ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY (AT) REFERRAL & DEVICE LENDING LIBRARY PROGRAM Dr. Galvan demonstrated several examples of the 4000+ AT devices CRIL can access for lending to consumers:

- **Pocket-Talker:** Assistive listening device that amplifies sounds & improves clarity of speech.
- **Cell Phone Amplifier:** Amplifies sound so it is much louder when connected by a cable to your cell phone.
- Roger Pen: Enables individuals to hear & understand more speech in background noise & over distance.
- Serene Hands-Free Direct Talk & Personal Listener: A hands-free assistive listening device.



- **Sonic Alert:** An alarm clock that vibrates when placed under a mattress to alert those with hearing loss.
- Vision Magnifiers: A variety of types where each magnifies 4, 10 or 12 times the original item.
- **Big Reading Magnifier:** Big, clear magnifier that moves across the page that you are trying to read.
- **Big Speaking Calculator:** A calculator with big numbers & also speaks to assist persons with vision loss.
- **Business Cards with Braille:** Card information in both normal writing & in Braille for those with vision loss.
- **Pens with Grips:** Rubber grips that help persons hold & write with a pen even when they have arthritis.
- Ergonomic Mouse: Helps to keep one's wrist straight & avoid carpel tunnel syndrome.
- Transfer Assistance Bars: Tools that can help individuals get in & out of a car.
- Specialized Eating Utensils: Big, heavy swivel eating spoons & forks & non-skid plates.

Dr. Galvan concluded by reminding us that Californians may borrow their AT devices *free* of charge for 30 days with a 30-day extension possible. They even make home visits to help consumers determine what devices they need.

Your old batteries can be recycled by putting them in a plastic ziplock bag and placing on top of your recycling waste container on your trash pick-up day. Batteries are considered hazardous waste and may not be thrown in the regular trash.

OR Join hearOclub which is a hearing aid and cochlear implant battery subscription service which delivers DieHard brand batteries on a set schedule (with free shipping!).
