Microphone Usage

I posted this on Facebook and got several positive reactions. Be sure to voice your opinion if the speaker in front of a room suggests he has a loud voice and doesn't think he needs to use a microphone.

If you are in a group setting where a microphone is available, please do not think that because you have a loud voice, you do not need to use the microphone. Most likely, there is at least one person, probably more, that will not be able to hear or understand you. Loudness is not the only issue. Hearing and understanding depend on the clearness of the spoken words, the ability of the listener to see you, the familiarity with the subject being discussed, the quality of the voice, the speed of the spoken voice, other background noise in the room, and other factors that influence the ability to hear and understand. There are times when I hear and understand almost everything said. Other times I hear most of what is said, but only understand parts of it. It could be a little or could be a lot. Sometimes I cannot hear and therefore cannot understand. When I firmly request that the microphone be used, it sometimes is used and sometimes is not used. Too many people do not understand the necessity for using a microphone so that people with hearing loss can understand and participate.

Meetings are on the 2nd Wednesday of the month, September to June. All Meetings are Audio Looped and Captioned. Meetings are held in the San Jose Masonic Center, 2500 Masonic Drive, San Jose, CA 95125. Look for us in the Red Dining Room, off from the main lobby.

Batteries for Cochlear Implants

Cochlear Implants (CIs) require a more powerful battery than hearing aids. Most CIs use a brand-specific rechargeable battery. Some offer the option of using disposable P675 batteries. You can use a 675 hearing aid battery in a CI, but it won't last as long. Most stores and even audiology offices do not normally carry P675 batteries. I asked at Costco if they had P675 batteries and was given 675 batteries. I was told they were the same thing, which I knew was not true.

The only place we found P675 batteries on a Sunday was at <u>Batteries Plus Bulbs</u>, a store which only sells batteries and bulbs. I highly recommend keeping a sufficient supply of these hard to find batteries.

Recycling

I received a Facebook message asking me to stop recycling, particularly plastics. I thought to myself, it is okay (and preferred) to still recycle hearing aid batteries. So we will still offer members that option at our Library Table. Bring your used batteries to our meetings and let us help you recycle them. With many popular hardware stores closed or closing, the number of places to recycle batteries is decreasing.

The essence is that there is just too much plastic being recycled and the markets that were buying it, namely China, is stopping the practice. Instead of selling it, it is going into landfills.

So my message is keep using hearing aid batteries and bring the old ones to us or your audiologist to recycle. Try to reduce the amount of other recyclable products brought into your home. The longer we wait, the worse the problem becomes.

Degree Designations

Have you ever wondered what all the letters that follow a hearing professional's name mean? Here are the answers:

Au.D.—Doctor of Audiology

CCC-A—Certificate of Clinical Competency in Audiology, issued by the American Speech Language and Hearing Association (ASHA)

F-AAA—Fellows of the American Academy of Audiology

ABA—Board certification by the American Board of Audiology

Seeking to Eliminate Term "Hearing Impaired"

A measure was brought before the Oregon Senate's Committee on Education to use only the preferred terms "deaf" and "hard of hearing." This is interesting because many hard of hearing people have been seeking to use the term "people with hearing loss."

Audiences

The Latin origin of the word audience means "a group of listeners." I would wonder if a group of profoundly hard of hearing or deaf people gather for a performance, are they then not an audience?

Hearing Loss Statistics

The most recent statistics I could find on people with hearing loss are from the World Health Organization from 2018:

466 million people in the world (approximately 5%) have disabling hearing loss, and 34 million are children.


