MEETING NOTES: "Captioning in Glasses"

At our March 9., 2024, HLAA-EB Chapter meeting, our guest speaker was Riley Ellingsen, who is the co-founder and CEO of heARsight, which is a new invention that will provide captions literally before an individual's very eyes. Initially, Riley explained that he is part of a 6-person team that includes 2 co-founders/CEOs, 2 developers and 2 managers, which have commenced and run this innovative Augmented Reality heARsight (AR). He further explained that the genesis of the idea and plan behind this start-up occurred while working on a Master's Degree at Notre Dame, when they were called upon ". . . to be a force for good in the world". Many fellow classmates and others were trying to deal with the day-to-day range of hearing loss problems, including deafness, they were experiencing.



The Problem of Hearing Loss (HL) and the Lack of Diagnosis & Treatment: Recognizing the substantial number of individuals having some degree of hearing loss, Riley noted that a much lower number of persons get appropriately treated for their hearing loss problems. He speculated that the lack of proper diagnosis and treatment of hearing loss problems may be based on: 1) Stigma of hearing loss; 2) Inadequate usability of the current tools available to cope with hearing loss; 3) Expense of tools available to adequately deal with hearing loss.

The Mission, Vision & Objectives of heARsight: Riley set out heARsight's guiding statements, as follows:

> **Mission Statement:** The mission of heARsight is to do the following:

- ✓ Empower people who are deaf or hard of hearing (HOH) with innovative solutions to their problems:
- ✓ Contribute to their clear speech comprehension and improved quality of life;
- ✓ Produce a transcription application that seamlessly pairs with smart glasses that provide real-time subtitles in a heads-up display.
- > Vision Statement: heARsight will empower people who are deaf and hard-of-hearing to:
 - ✓ Feel more included in social settings;
 - ✓ Pursue new career opportunities and/or return to former careers lost;
 - ✓ Strengthen and maintain relationships;
 - ✓ Navigate life with enhanced confidence and independence.
- ➤ **Their Objectives**: The specific objectives of heARsight are three-fold:
 - ✓ To ensure precise, reliable, trustworthy and dependable transcription of speech communication;
 - ✓ To offer comfort and convenience by selecting light weight and slim hardware;
 - ✓ To provide ease of use through simple learning to navigate and pair speech and captions in glasses.
- > Other Types of Screen Transcriptions: Other forms of screen captioning often have limitations such as:
 - ✓ Limited mobility
 - ✓ Difficulty of clear speaker identification, especially in groups
 - ✓ Disruption of flow of conversation or discussion
 - ✓ Limited engagement with speakers or other people

How heARsight (AR) Works: Referring to his PowerPoint slides, Riley next described step=by=step how heARsight works:

- Create an account from their AR website & choose a trial option under the AR plan.
- Choose companion glasses on their site.
- Download heARsight, soon to be available.
- Pair the glasses & activate the AR application.

ActiveLook's Engo Glasses: Again directing us to the pictures on his PowerPoint slides, Riley proceeded to describe the Engo Glasses offered by ActiveLook that are compatible with their heARsight

captioning application. He pointed out some features of the Engo Glasses which make them particularly compatible with heARsight:

- Designed for "on the go" work and personal lifestyle.
- ➡ Wireless/no cords 12=hour battery life for all-day heads=up captioning.
- Crafted with light-weight materials for wearer's comfort & convenience.

Membership Plan Options: Riley set out the membership plan options available through heARsight, as well as the costs and trial period for each one from which interested parties can choose. Riley went on to cite some of the details of a chose of either the monthly option or annual option under the single heARsight plan. He did note that the monthly option is more flexible, but the annual option is the best value in terms of costs and length of trial period. He urged interested folks to review specific costs and trial periods for each option, along with costs of Engo Glasses, on their website, while reminding us that costs and trial periods may change over time.

Progress, Early Access and Wait List: Riley explained that both heARsight and ActiveLook's Engo Glasses are currently evolving and are in various stages of development and testing before launching of their unique captioning products. Nevertheless, Riley and his heARsight team members feel like they are making good progress toward full launching of heARsight and Engo Glasses. Meanwhile, they wish to offer an opportunity to enjoy a demonstration of their products and a possibility to join their wait list for participating in one of their trial tests by visiting their sites identified below:

Wrap-Up: Our guest speaker Riley Ellingsen supplemented his very interesting informative presentation on captioning in glasses by showing a video demonstration of how heARsight and Engo Glasses actually work together. He also followed up his presentation with an open-ended Q & A session where he responded to audience members' many questions about a wide range of practical captioning issues, such as accuracy and readability of captions in various settings, along with hardware considerations of costs and trial periods for heARsight and Engo Glasses. Finally, Riley extended an invitation to anyone interested to contact him directly by email or phone for further information or questions about heARsight and Engo Glasses.



The study will test the benefits of different AI hearing aids. It will take approximately one hour and you will be compensated with a target gift card for your time. - Over 18 years old
- Mild or Moderate hearing loss
