MEETING NOTES: "Our 2024 HLAA-EB Chapter Holiday Party: Good Food, Socialization, and An Informal Discussion about Hearing Loss"

At this 2024 end-of-the year EB Chapter meeting, we did not schedule a guest speaker, but instead invited EB members, family and friends to join us for one more opportunity to socialize and participate in an informal discussion about hearing loss.



Introductions & Honors: As we got started with our Dec. 14th Holiday Party, our attendees, which included HLAA-EB members, family and friends, were welcomed by our EB Leader Len Bridges (see pix left) and invited to have some coffee and bagels while socializing for a bit with other attendees. Then, our Leader took the mic and urged attendees to grab some more drink and snacks while finding a seat at the table. He proceeded with introducing the other members of our hard-working EB Steering Committee (SC) Leadership Team and the specific title/role they voluntarily play in running our EB Chapter so

effectively.

At that time, our Leader Len asked our tech wizard George Chin, Sr. to introduce one more volunteer, namely Audrey Spinka (see pix right). She has served as our online and in-person captioner for many years. In recognition of her important volunteer services that are so vital in helping us to understand and participate fully in our monthly meetings, we on the SC Team believed that honoring her at this Holiday Party with a Visa gift card and a flowering potted plant was well deserved.



A Quick Review of EB 2024 Hearing Loss Meetings: In 2024, we enjoyed quite an amazing line-up of interesting and knowledgeable guest speakers. Typically, our guest speakers were experts in their field, ranging from audiologists, medical doctors, lawyers, to individuals who use some type of hearing aids (HA's), cochlear implants (Cl's), and/or other kind of assistive technology which has helped them with their hearing loss to live a better everyday life. Usually, our guest speakers stayed around after their presentation to participate in a follow-up Question & Answer session/discussion and offer their contact information and websites where interested parties can reach them for more information.

Good Food, Drink, & Socialization: In addition, our monthly hearing loss meetings have served as a wonderful opportunity to take a break from busy schedules, or in some cases, to draw individuals out of their hearing loss self-isolating situations to meet and share with other folks who are also experiencing some level of hearing loss.

An Informal Discussion about Hearing Loss: Although we did not have a formal guest presentation at our Holiday Party, our SC members facilitated an informal Q & A session and open-ended discussion about hearing loss topics. One of our SC members Peter Townsend distributed a list of some of the most recent presentation topics from this past year to audience members to remind them of some of the issues about which they might wish to comment or ask questions. He then took the mic around to audience members who indicated they had something to say. The unstructured discussion was very lively and upbeat about personal experiences in dealing with their hearing loss, as well as some of the strategies they were using while trying to get help from others. Some persons mentioned their own background, how they had discovered they were experiencing hearing loss, and what they were doing about it. Others described the type of hearing aids, cochlear implants, or assistive hearing devices on which they rely. One thread clearly running through the discussion was the great value found in participating in our monthly EB Chapter Hearing Loss Meetings.


